

## WHAT WE DO

- OA supports 6 schools in Tanzania: 3 preschools, 1 elementary school, 1 high school, and 1 vocational college
  - Pay tuition, supplies, and provide nutritious meals
  - Purchase health insurance for students so they can visit the local clinic when they are ill
  - Build wells for clean water at the schools
  - Build classrooms and dormitories
  - Install solar power for electricity
  - Provide educational materials: books, science lab equipment, tools, machinery, and more.
  - Offer hope, encouragement, hugs, and lots of love!

#### **Mwaji Secondary School**

Mwaji Secondary School is located in a small village in a remote mountainous area of Tanzania. With Orphans Africa's help, it has grown from a small bamboo shack to a thriving school campus.

We've built classrooms, a water well, dormitories, science laboratories, an administration hall, teacher housing, a library, and a teacher's office. We provide furniture, textbooks, school supplies, uniforms, medical supplies, health insurance and a food program.

We are working with the school to develop programs so the school can be self-sufficient in the future.

#### **Marilynn Primary and Nursery School**

Since 2007, Orphans Africa has developed Marilynn Primary and Nursery School into a beautiful campus. They now have clean water, working restrooms, classrooms, school supplies, a food program, and health insurance.

This school has an excellent reputation for quality education. These students consistently achieve high marks and most all of them graduate and go on to high school.

As with all of our schools, our goal is for them to become self-sustaining. This means they will no longer need our financial or managerial help to operate.

Marilynn Primary and Nursery School is successfully working towards this goal.






### **Mbozi Nursery School**

Nursery schools in Tanzania don't typically teach curriculum. The schools function more like babysitters. We run our nursery schools differently. We teach ABCs, counting, basic English, and more.

These children need love, and we provide lots of that! We also provide medical insurance, clean water, daily porridge, and the opportunity to play.

Mbozi Nursery School is a model of self-sustainability. Any extra funds go towards helping supplement nearby Chimbuya Nursery School.




### **Chimbuya Nursery School**

Chimbuya is one of the most impoverished areas in Tanzania. Most children in this area do not attend any school.

We provide school supplies, daily porridge, a well for clean water, and teach a curriculum of ABCs, numbers, basic English, and more. We have bought shoes, backpacks, toothbrushes/toothpaste and other necessities for the children.

Our little Chimbuya children meet in a one room classroom. There can be up to 40 children with one teacher. We would like to hire another teacher and build a two-room structure with a teacher's office, plus a safe play area for the children outside.
